



The Power of Reading

- The more you read, the more you know
- The more we know, the more intelligent we become
- The more intelligent we become, the more likely we are to be happier, healthier, safer and to live longer!
- Improves your concentration and memory
- Reduces stress and helps you relax
- Reading is a culturally beneficial activity





20 minutes reading...

- Students who read for just 20 minutes a day do better at school (and in life)
- On average, you know more than 1 million words than a learner who only reads for 1 minute per day

Regular reading impacts a child's success at school. If not addressed early the educational gap widens... Child A Child B Child C Reads 20 minutes **Reads 5 minutes Reads 1 minute** per day per day per day 3,600 minutes 900 minutes 180 minutes per school year per school year per school year 1,800,000 words per school year 282,000 words per school year 8.000 words per school year Scores in the Scores in the Scores in the 50th percentile 90th percentile 10th percentile Standardised Test Scores By the end of grade 6, Child A will have read the equivalent of 60 school days, Child B will have read for 12

- Schedule time to read
- Keep background noise to a minimum
- Go to a familiar favourite
