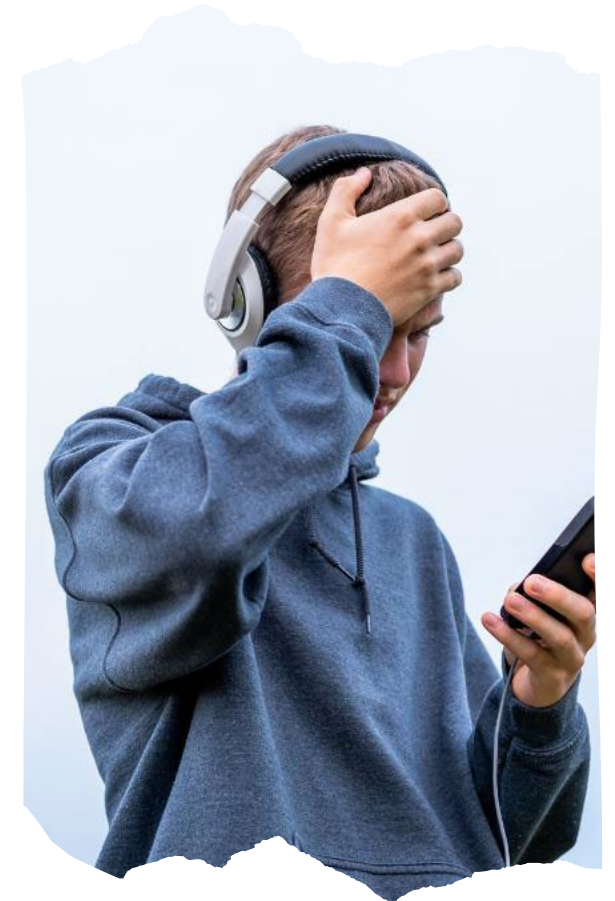
Tier 3 Vocabulary	Definition
Crown Prosecution Service	The Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) prosecutes criminal cases that have been investigated by the police and other investigative organisations in England and Wales. The CPS is independent, and make their decisions independently of the police and government. Their duty is to make sure that the right person is prosecuted for the right offence, and to bring offenders to justice wherever possible.
Citizens Advice	Citizens Advice is an independent organisation specialising in confidential information and advice to assist people with legal, debt, consumer, housing and other problems in the UK.

Support for victims of crime - under 18

The Crown Prosecution Service (England & Wales) have produced a document that details the support under-18s should expect if they have been victims of crime: "The victims' code: U18s"

In Scotland, the charity Victim Support Scotland works closely with the Procurator Fiscal and police to provide support for victims of crime, including young people.

In Northern Ireland, nidirect government services have advice and support available for victims of crime.
