This week's focus is on TikTok. Many parents have shared with us that they struggle to understand "the ins and outs" of social media apps such as

TikTok – which is being increasingly used amongst young people.

TikTok is a video sharing social media platform used to create and share short form videos that allows users to express themselves through singing, dancing, comedy, and lip-syncing. Risks include profiles being public and viewable by "anybody", accessing inappropriate content, communication from unknown individuals, in-app purchases, addiction, and more.
