

It's A Boy!


Year 11 assembly today saw a lovely message from their HOY Ms Whitehouse after leaving on maternity. The message we got was

Making Lifetime Memories

Written by Leon Williams, year 8, whilst in hospital :

Saturday 8th March 2025, a memory to last a life time.

I play football for the Wolves Foundation Disability Team, all I ever wanted to do was play football and be accepted something a SEND child longs for, I see the world different and that's the only difference between me and you.

After hounding my mom to try and get me on a football team and never been selected for the school team, she reached out to Wolves Fans Service who directed her to the Wolves Foundation.

Gav (Community & Cohesion Officer (Disability) contacted us and invited me to a training session, I went and loved it, it wasn't a disability team it was like minded young people playing a game they loved with any ability needs.

Wolves Foundation believed in me before I believed in myself and on 8th March 2025 they ask if I would do the greatest honour of walking out on the hallow turf to play the half time match against Everton, 30,738 attendees.

I recall my anxiety being at its highest, I was the youngest player on the pitch this was my team, the biggest achievement to date. The fans were chanting, I led the front of team A onto the pitch, we knew the match about to be played was in honour of a former Wolves Foundation Player who died at 19, we paid our respects and the whistle blew, the most magical feeling ever when all I could hear was the fans chanting "Wolves Ay We".

Wolves Foundation a charity that prides themselves to educate and inspire local people and communities, creating opportunities and changing lives.


KS3 Science Assessments

Do You Send Your Child To School With Cash?



Important update regarding our school's payment system

We are transitioning to a completely cashless system for all payments.

For many years, the majority of our community has successfully used ParentPay to top up dinner money and pay for trips. Moving forward, ParentPay will be the only method available for these transactions from Easter 2025. The machines for putting money on student accounts will be removed over the easter holidays.

The primary reason for this change is to enhance the security and efficiency of our payment processes. By eliminating cash handling, we can reduce the risk of loss or theft and streamline administrative tasks. Additionally, this system enables us to trace all payments quickly, avoids

the need for pupils to carry cash, and saves valuable time for both parents and staff. Currently, there are fewer than 60 transactions processed through our cash machines each week, making this transition a practical and timely step.

We understand that this is a significant change, and we appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we make this transition. To ease the process, we will continue to accept cash for the purchase of planners and ties for the time being. However, our goal is to eventually eliminate all cash transactions within the school.

County Finals for Basketball



Last week saw the county finals Basketball for Idsall Students representing East Shropshire from the counties 6 areas.

Full of hope after domination of the East Shropshire 4 team qualifier earlier this year. We knew the standard would be high and games get tougher in this round robin tournament of each team playing each other. Each team had won their groups so the county cup final is very high standard!

First game vs Bishops Castle representing South Shropshire saw Idsall crash the boards on rebounds with great defensive play - final score a win to Idsall 18 points to 1.

Next up a very well organised Meole Brace representing Shrewsbury, these had the best player of the tournament who we knew we had to keep quiet, we did that and took our chances with both layups and set shots being on target for a 11-9 points Win.

Third game was actually the decider against a very Fast Charlton team with over 15 players so they were well rested and we had just come off playing back to back. A few missed rebounds at both ends meant our first defeat to the eventual winners - 6 points to 13.

Still with hope we battled on knowing if we won our remaining games we could still win.

Game 4 vs HLC representing Telford and we despite being tired and the boys rotating well during games we hung on for a 10 points to 5 win, there was still hope.

Next Idsall played Holy Trinity Academy, winning 9-1.


Our third game was against a tough Ercall Wood side, it was goal for goal, drawing 3 all at half time, however, we managed to edge ahead and take a 7-5 win.


