Section 1: Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare

Task 1: Understanding the Plot

- 1. Summarise the main storyline of *Romeo and Juliet* in your own words.
- 2. What are the key events in each act of the play? Create a timeline.
- 3. Why do you think Shakespeare chose to end the play with a tragedy?

Task 2: Character Exploration

Choose **two** characters and answer the following:

- How are they introduced?
- What are their motivations?
- How do they change over the course of the play?
- What happens to them, and why?

Character options: Romeo, Juliet, Mercutio, Tybalt, Nurse, Lord/Lady Capulet, Friar Laurence

Task 3: Language and Techniques

Find and write down **three quotes** from the play that you think are powerful. Then, for each:

- Identify the technique (e.g. metaphor, oxymoron, foreshadowing, personification, dramatic irony).
- Explain the **effect** of the language used.
- What does the quote reveal about the character or situation?

Task 4: Themes and Relevance

1. What are some of the central themes in *Romeo and Juliet?* Examples: love, fate, violence, family honour, identity

- 2. Choose one theme and explain how it is presented in the play.
- 3. Is this theme still relevant in the world today? Give examples.

Task 5: Creative Response

Choose **one** of the following tasks:

- **Diary Entry**: Write a diary entry from the perspective of Juliet the night before she takes the sleeping potion.
- **Modern Adaptation**: Rewrite a short scene in a modern-day setting using current language, technology, or location.
- **Character Debate**: Write a speech defending or blaming one character for the tragic ending. Include persuasive techniques.

Task 1: What is a Career?

- Write your own definition of a career.
- How does a career differ from a job or part-time work?
- Why is career planning important?

Task 2: Labour Market Information (LMI)

- What does the term Labour Market Information mean?
- Why should you look at job trends and local industry needs when making career choices?
- Name three careers currently in high demand in the UK. Why?

Task 3: Apprenticeships

- Define what an apprenticeship is.
- How does it differ from full-time university study?
- What are the advantages and possible disadvantages of apprenticeships?
- Research and list three real apprenticeship opportunities in fields you're interested in.

Task 4: GCSEs and Beyond

- 1. What subjects have you chosen for GCSE?
- 2. Why did you choose them?
- 3. How do your choices link to possible careers? Research each subject and what career they link to.
- 4. Are there any skills you would like to develop further outside of school?

Task 5: Future Career Research

Choose one career you are interested in and research the following:

- What qualifications or experience are needed?
- What subjects does this career link to?

- What skills or personal qualities are important?
- What is the average salary?
- What are the working hours and environment like?
- Is the job in high demand or growing?

Write your findings below or create a short report or poster.
